College monitoring system ensures continuous achievements of the curricular goals. To supplements this college obtains feedback from students and parents meetings which are used to decide the necessary training requirements. The college has enhanced the quality of its curricular aspects by ensuring staff and faculty training.

This year college has organized two national conferences. Faculty members are allowed to attend refresher and orientation courses. Faculty members presenting their research papers in national and international conferences and seminars.

College ensures that students gain beneficial and compressive learning experiences by providing them opportunity for access to new areas of education by adopting a new method of delivering education inputs, by enhancing the quality of teachers and by improving the standards of teaching aids.

To ensure the best possible implementation of these goals of the college. Departments have undertaken various measures to sustain the quality of education offered in the college. By orientation lectures offered were made to update the knowledge the students at the entry level.

Slow learners are identified through personal interaction and classroom discussion. To cater to the needs of the slow learners teachers adopt bilingual teaching, provide class notes, give detailed explanations on topics, remedial teaching, assist in solving past question papers etc. To cater the needs of the advanced learner's special guest lectures, class seminars, academic competitions are organized.

Teachers are encouraged to integrate technology in their teaching and ensure that students are provided training in the use of computer and other technologies.

Continuous expansions of learning resources are carried out to ensure the availability of latest information to students. College gives access to many online journals and books through library net facility.

Two teachers received grants for their research projects and one ongoing project.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation:

The college being affiliated institution follows the examination and evaluation system prescribed by SPPU. For the P.G. courses credit based semester system has been introduced along with continuous assessment. As a part of these students are evaluated on the basis of class test, seminar presentations, projects, quiz test etc.

The college continuous to place the emphasis on research course which encourages staff to undertake M.Phil and Ph.D. studies and minor and major research projects. In the pursuit of these the faculties are provided with infrastructural facility office space and leave facility.

Faculty members have published fourteen international papers in peer revived journal and one non peer revived journals five papers in conference proceeding and two papers each in national and one state level conference proceeding. Two staff members have one each ongoing miner research project funded by BCUD Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune. Four staff members have submitted application for research funding. One national and one state level conference organized by Dept. of Commerce and Chemistry.

6.3.5. Library, ICT and Physical infrastructure /instrumentation.

The college has maintenance system for the physical infrastructure beautification of the campus is also undertaken periodically. Buildings are annually repainted, furniture's are repaired and replaced, and laboratories are refurnished by purchasing new equipment's.
