CRITERION I – CURRICULAR ASPECTS

1.1 – Curriculum Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 – Institution has the mechanism for well planned curriculum delivery and documentation. Explain in 500 words

The college at the beginning of every academic year prepares an academic calendar. It is a proposed Calendar prepared by the Committee in charge for that academic year. It is in Co- ordination with the SPPU examination and holidays given. Every department prepares its syllabus planning before starting of the Session. This is prepared by every faculty member, it is then given to

the HOD, Vice - principal and principal for its finalization. The same is forwarded to the NAAC Co- ordinator for documentation of the same. The students of the FYBA/B.COM and B.sc. are given an introductory lecture on curriculum and exam pattern existing and to be followed. The implementation of the same is carried out by the Committees Concerned. The Curriculum is of course designed by the university to be followed by the Colleges. Some of the staff members are involved in the syllabus planning of the SPPU. The teachers at the beginning of the Session give their workload, Time table and tentative plan of the activities to be conducted by each department. The teaching faculty sees that it completes its teaching in the number of working days given as per the Circulars. Same faculty members as per their Concerned departments take their students for study tours, field visits conduct Seminar or take students students to other colleges for attending seminar. The college also conducts certain academic elocution Competitions related to topic in economics filmshows for students of English are conducted, essay Competition etc. Teachers go as experts to different colleges to give lectures. The method of teaching is more with blackboard & chalk, along with power- point presentation asking students to use technology. The students are given instructions and explanations in both the medium English and Marathi. The exam department displays every notice concerned with examination as given by SPPU. Notices regarding students Internal and External examinations details of the filling of forms, its last date and date with late fee is displayed. The details of the commencement of each examination are displayed whether internal or external. The time table along with the subjects and dates of practical and Viva Voce are put up on the notice board. The submission date of each practical is decaled by the teachers concerned and informed to the students well in advance most of the faculty members of the concerned subjects which have practical also are invited as external Senior supervisors, on examination squads etc. The declaration of the result is in general put on the notice board. i.e total pass percentage of that faculty and the names of the first three student of each faculty. The teachers prepare Question bank for the students as per their subjects and set Question papers for the same. Some of the faculty members are also paper setters at SPPU examinations. Every faculty also keeps recorded of its results of each academic year. The college thus tries its best to be in line as per the planning and implementation.
